There is no credible evidence that the death penalty deters crime more effectively than a prison term. In fact, evidence reveals the opposite. Since abolishing the death penalty in 1976, Canada's murder rate has steadily declined, and as of 2016 was at its lowest since 1966. May 8, 2019. Read for yourself.
