**UPDATE:** The sponsors didn't run the bill. Watching SB1095 / HB129 Salaries and Benefits - As introduced, raises the minimum wage paid to tipped employees from \$2.13 to \$2.50 per hour; authorizes an employer to take a tip credit toward its minimum wage obligations up to the amount permitted by federal law. UPDATE: Several bills were introduced to raise hourly wages non passed. **LEARN MORE about this bill**
