Juveniles in solitary confinement | Bill HB1185 / SB0655

Senator Robinson (-Memphis) Representative Chism (Memphis)

This bill prohibits juvenile detention facilities from placing any juvenile offender in solitary confinement, except in accordance with the following guidelines:

- 1) Solitary confinement must not be used before other less restrictive options have been attempted and exhausted, unless attempting those options poses a threat to the safety of any other minor, inmate, or staff;
- 2) Solitary confinement must not be used for the purposes of coercion, convenience, or retaliation by staff; and
- 3) A juvenile detention facility may place a minor offender who presents a serious security risk or an imminent threat to the safety of another in solitary confinement, without a hearing, for a period not to exceed 22 hours; Click here and click summary for the rest of the summary.

Action deferred in Senate Judiciary Committee and returned to the Clerk's Desk in the House. Bill is still alive and can be heard next year.
